Structure consists of an upper, roughly oval, apparently walled area 9m x 7m, the longer axis almost N-S, with a central, low area. Most of the rocks are of fairly uniform size but the wall is poorly constructed. There may be an entrance to the NE, but several large rocks on the W side may be the 'portals' of an entrance. These currently sit on top of the smaller rocks forming the W wall. Running to the S is an 8m long tapering 'tail' formed of a raised area with several large rocks on it. There are indications that the structure sat on a platform which has been dug into the hillside to the north. There are other, linear stone structures to the immediate E. At the coast below the site, some 150m distant, are several boat nausts which may be associated.
