Lime kiln 100m to east of Mingary Castle, possibly the kiln used to make the mortar for the castle. 4m wide by 3m deep, set into bank so that raw materials could be poured in from above and lime removed from front. Surrounding rock is limestone.

This is not thought to be the kiln used to build the original castle but perhaps that used in the 18<sup>th</sup> century alterations.
